Green Gang magazine produced by the White Cliffs Countryside Partnership. The Green Gang is a special programme of fun events for children and their families that has been running for over 20 years. Learn more about local wildlife and countryside. Most of the events are free, and you don't have to be a member. A donation is appreciated to help cover the running costs of the Green Gang.

POND DIPPING

Pond dipping can be great fun as there are many different types of animals that live in or around ponds. Some creatures live their whole life in a pond, like leeches, fresh water shrimps and snails. Other creatures live part of their life-cycles beneath the water before



spend the first part of their lives in ponds as tadpoles. They quickly grow into adults and crawl out of the pond to live on land only returning to the pond to breed. Dragonflies and damselflies also live part of their life cycle underwater.

The adults lay eggs in the summer on the plant life. These hatch into nymphs, which are ferocious carnivores eating larvae and tadpoles. By late spring and through the summer, they crawl up a plant stalk, where they burst out of the nymph shell into an amazingly beautiful adult dragonfly that lives for about three weeks. Why not find out more about pond life by joining in a pond dipping event on the 29 March at Bushy Ruff.

CARING FOR THE COUNTRYSIDE

'Caring for the Countryside' events are practical conservation days where local people carry out practical work to improve the sites for wildlife and people. The leader explains about the work and how to use the tools. Why not come along and give it a go? You can even count these events towards one of your Junior Ranger days. You don't have to stay all day - even just for

an hour or two. Children (under 18) must be accompanied at all times by a parent or responsible adult. We provide gloves and tools, but please wear old clothes (and waterproof clothing if it's forecasts rain) and boots that protect your toes and have good grip, and bring a cold drink and packed lunch if you want to stay all day. HOW TO DECORATE AN EGG

Why not make your own decorated Easter egg and bring it along to the Easter Egg Rolling on Friday 25 March.

You will need a hard boiled egg (boiled for twenty minutes), so you will need an adult to help you with this. You will then need to



cool the egg down, so put it in some cold water until it is cool to touch and then put it in the fridge. Once it is cold you will be able to decorate it. You can use food dyes to colour the whole egg, as well as using watercolour paints or glitter to colour them. You can then add ribbon, stickers or sequins to decorate them.

To dye the egg using food colouring: Half fill a cup with boiling water and then add one tablespoon of food colouring and two teaspoons of vinegar. Gently put the egg into the cup and leave it there until you get the colour you want. Carefully remove the egg and then leave to dry. You can create patterns on the egg by using crayons before putting the egg into the water. The waxiness of the crayon will stop the egg shell from changing colour so you will be left with a pattern of what you have drawn.

Please note that you will not be able to eat the egg afterwards.

MAKE A BEE HOME

There are over 200 different types of bees in Britain and some like to live in holes in the ground. You can help the bees by making a home for them. All you

will need is a terracotta flowerpot with one main hole in the bottom and something flat and solid to make a plate to put it on. Choose a spot in a sunny area of your garden and dig a small hole, big enough to bury your pot level with the hole at the top. Place the plate at the bottom of the hole to keep the pot dry. Collect some dried material, like moss, shredded paper and put it inside the pot. Place the pot on top of the plate carefully turning the pot upside down so that the small hole is facing upwards. Put back the soil around the upturned pot and then place some small stones around the edge of the opening. Keep and eye on it and in a few days you should see some bees

investigating their new home!
