Dear Parents,

With the challenges the world is facing right now, we can all be excused for feeling a little bit low. No matter who I talk to in and outside of education, people comment how busy they are and how tired they are feeling. I wonder why this is, what we can do and how much of this feeling can be linked to post lockdown working?

In school when things are really busy, there is one thing that I can do that is guaranteed to re-energise me. I go for a long walk around the school, visit lessons and speak to the children. Last week, I taught in Years 2, 4 and 6. It has been delightful and so nice to connect with the children in the classroom. They are always so happy and energetic, often telling me about their learning but also random things too - whose party they are going to, what their new pet is going to be called and what they are looking forward to doing at the weekend. Sometimes the children just randomly tell me how old their parents are or just throw their arms around my legs or try and fist bump me. It shows me just how happy the children are but also reminds me to look at what is now - the present. If we can find a few minutes each day to think about things we are grateful for, we can remind ourselves of all the small things and caring people that make a huge difference in our lives. These are the important things to think about. What are you grateful for?

I know my team here work amazingly hard for the children and community but we are also very blessed to have the ongoing community support from yourselves that we do. Our values of friendship and service regularly shine through our community. I want to thank you for your support with the Ukraine appeals and the peace prayers that are being made at the gate. Just this morning, friendship and compassion have stood out to me. I saw a few parents spending a few minutes in reflection and tying a prayer on the gate, several children walking into school giggling and smiling with each other and parents offering to help each other out with small issues. Then, in our Worship, a child came in with a prayer for peace she wanted to read out. It was so thoughtful and reflected the meaning of Friendship to others so well.

This week we are looking at the Commonwealth as it is Commonwealth Day. The children will be learning a little bit about the Commonwealth and what it is and why it was formed. We will share some of this learning on our Facebook page.

We will be having our parent consultations at the end of this term, with appointment letters being sent soon. In the main, we will try and keep them online as it seems to work so much better. 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Easter Holidays

You may well be aware that in June of this year, the country will be celebrating the Queen's Jubilee. The May Bank Holiday weekend will be moved to Thursday 2nd June and an additional Bank Holiday on Friday 3rd June will see a four-day weekend to celebrate Her Majesty, The Queen's Platinum Jubilee - the first time any British monarch has reached this historic milestone.

This is great news for us all but this also falls within our half term holiday. This means that the staff and children will not benefit from this entitlement. Given that the Easter holiday is on the horizon, we feel that the best way to ensure staff are able to receive this additional entitlement and limit the impact on operations of the school is to extend the Easter holiday by one day.
