Headteacher's Update

Dear Parents/Carers,

This has been a week that has made me very proud to be the Headteacher of St. Mary's and it all began with one of the most incredible experiences when Mrs. Cotton and I, ably assisted by Smarty (S-Mary-T) the School Teddy, went to the House of Commons to receive the Award from the British Council for the whole school's work with International Schools. What an honour and a privilege it was to be there and to be personally celebrated by our local MP, Damien Collins.

So, 180 schools in the UK applied for the award, 40 of which were successful in achieving it. Two schools were given a special mention in the congratulatory speech, one of which was St. Mary's and this was for all the children's work on Weather Watching and Climate Change. I have to thank the wonderful Mrs. Cotton for spear-heading this whole entry for the Award and for inspiring all the lovely members of the Global Council in forging such strong links with so many countries around the world.

And then, Mrs. Judd witnessed a precious moment in her Forest School session on Monday, when some children exemplified what we're trying to achieve in respect of the British Value of Tolerance. A group of girls were playing with the pots and pans outside and making dinners. They invited Mrs. Judd to join them and try their food; so, of course, she asked what they were all having. One said "Pizza," another said "Rice," another said "Borscht" and another said, "Mac and Cheese." Their play totally reflected the mix of cultures they were from and it was lovely to see them all enjoying their 'feast' together.

Some of the children also learnt how to use a fire striker to light a 'fairy fire.' This can take quite a bit of perseverance in order to get the hang of it but the children impressed us so much by being so mature and careful with the strikers and it was brilliant to see how delighted and amazed they were with the mini fires they made.

And finally, I am also very proud of some members of our school community who have heroically supported the poor family of William Brown over the last few weeks. This has been an incredibly challenging time for many of us. I'm sure you would all like to join with me in the beautiful prayer that one of our teachers has written as a result of this tragic situation and our hearts go out to all who have been deeply affected.
