Dear All,

Having the children back in school is wonderful. It was certainly a little overwhelming for me at the start with so many faces back on the school site. At times, I found myself putting on a brave face and trusting that we would re-adjust. On speaking with many of our community, I do not think I am alone in this. We have been in a strange limbo for so long, the sudden rush of energy felt in the school was a reminder of just how far from normality we have been. We are adjusting and the children are once again showing us all just how resilient they are.

They have returned to school with a buzz and drive we haven't seen for a while and many of them seem to have really benefited from the more tailored learning the remote learning offered. We have certainly seen a lot of children blossom in their reading confidence. This really has highlighted the value of reading and the difference that can make. Our biggest worry was that the children would find the transition to school a challenge and finding themselves again readjusting to different routines and boundaries. They have nailed it and it is a credit to you as parents just how amazingly they have done this. We have had a few tears and wobbles, but the strength in character shown by the children is admirable. Simply super stars. The children run into school, they smile and say hi. The work around wellbeing with The Boy, The Mole, The Fox and The Horse that has continued in all classrooms seems to have really inspired the children. There are some amazing pieces of artwork and meaningful writing around this developing across the school. The children have really tapped into the simplicity of the artwork and the depth of dialogue around the messages within the book. We will be sharing this soon with you.

We are not out of the woods yet but we are in the spring and summer months now so the last few terms in school will be a wonderful time for the children. I do hope we can be together again for you to share in assemblies, sports days, fairs and other community events.

Around the school, there is a friendly and community feel. This is strengthened by yourselves as you come on the site. Many of you stop and say hi and talk. The thanks you have given us as a team and the real sense of gratitude we feel is inspiring. I truly believe that we are so much stronger now than ever before and it is our time to blossom and shine as a community. Thank you again for your support.

PE Kit

As you are aware, we are asking for pupils to come to school dressed in their PE kits on the days that they are due to have their PE session. Your child's class teacher will communicate which days these are. PE is a vital subject essential for health and wellbeing and it is important that children are prepared and safe for their PE sessions with the following kit:

A white round neck t-shirt.

Navy jogging bottoms/sports trousers. Navy shorts can be worn in warmer weather.

Black plimsolls (to be brought in school bags).

Trainers (your child may be using the field in some PE sessions and these may become muddy).

Navy jumper – children can wear their school jumper or a coat in cold weather.

It is important that pupils do have their hair tied back for PE sessions, where applicable, and that jewellery, including studded earrings, are not worn for these sessions.


