### School Dinners


Please note that if your child has a school meal, payment must be received at the beginning of each week in an envelope with the child's name and class entered on the envelope. The cost of a meal is £2.30 per meal per day. Cheques should be made payable to Caterlink. If payment is not received, Caterlink will not serve a meal to your child. Thank you.

In the New Year, Caterlink will be operating a cashless system. More details to follow very soon.

### International Work

We now have 24 enthusiastic Global Councillors (2 representatives from each class) who meet weekly; some of whom had the opportunity to meet Little Amal, the puppet refugee, when she came to Folkestone in October. The school has done some excellent work linked to the SDG's (Sustainable Development Goals) this term, in particular SDG 13 Climate-Action and COP26. Many of the classes wrote their own pledges on leaves saying what they will do to help support Climate-Action and a message for World Leaders. Some of these leaves were hung on trees in the Blue Zone at Cop26. We've shared our work linked on Climate Action through Zoom meetings with schools in Brazil, Moldova, Tunisia and Bangladesh. St. Mary's was just one of three U.K. schools who received 'A School of Excellence' award for this work.

Year 4, handed out their Fair Trade chocolate recipes in Folkestone Town Centre and are waiting to learn if they have achieved their Silver award. They've also been working closely with their partner school in Bangladesh and planted a Dogwood Tree for them.



During International Education Week in November, we participated in the annual World Weather Watch project collaborating with schools in 16 countries from Jamaica to Taiwan. Year 3 had a Zoom meeting with College Pilote in Sousse Tunisia, which was led by Miss Judd, a meteorologist who spent the day in school doing exciting weather experiments, cloud recognition and making weather vanes with the children.

Year 5's Spanish is growing rapidly and they have weekly videos with their partner school in Barcelona.

Year 2 have really enjoyed their two Indian dance lessons via Zoom, with the Dance teachers' & students at DAV BRS School Ludhiana India.



Pupils are sharing Christmas Greetings, with schools across the world, in our annual Christmas card project and Year 4 held a Zoom meeting with HIS Heritage International School in Moldova, where they sang a Christmas song and explained what Christmas Jumper day is. The children at H.I.S school then told us a little about a Moldovan Christmas.
