Ethic of Excellence

Your child may have mentioned the new 'Ethic of Excellence' to you. We have had some super proud pupils who have had their name moved to the Ethic of Excellence on the Recognition Board and have received a sticker on their own personalized chart as a result. The Ethic of Excellence recognizes outstanding achievement in a piece of work, progress in a particular subject or topic, exemplary behaviour or an exceptional demonstration of our values. Once the pupils have achieved 6 stickers, they will receive their bronze certificate and a small reward, as well as being celebrated in assembly.

School Uniform

BOYS Navy v-neck jumper, grey trousers/shorts, white shirt, Academy tie, navy/grey/black socks, black shoes

GIRLS Navy v-neck cardigan or navy V-neck jumper, grey pinafore, grey skirt, grey trousers, blue check dress (no stripes), white blouse, Academy tie, navy tights or white socks, black shoes

Appropriate school shoes, no high heels or trainers.

School ties may only be purchased from the Academy Office via Parent Pay.

Water bottles may also be purchased from the Academy Office via Parent Pay.

Children should be in possession of a white t-shirt, navy shorts and a pair of plimsolls for Physical Education lessons and it would be appreciated if parents of young children could provide the type of plimsolis for Physical Education lessons and it for laces. A simple bag, with name on the outside should be provided so that the PE kit can be left on your child's cloakroom peg or in locker. Drawstring bags can be purchased from the Academy Office and paid for via Parent Pay. Navy jogging/ tracksuit trousers and trainers can be used for P.E. on the school field. All clothing should be clearly marked with the owner's name and it is worthwhile checking from time to time to see that the marking is still visible.

Our Reception classes have launched their Beach School this term. This is where the children take their learning to the local beach. This term, they launched their new Pirate topic with a visit to Sunny Sands where they discovered a message in a bottle from a real pirate! We are extremely lucky to have such a wonderful place to visit within walking distance to the school. During term 6, the children will visit the beach weekly in small groups, where they will enjoy their Teacher directed sessions. Please could we ask that all children have a named water bottle in school and if it is a particularly sunny day, could you apply sun cream to your child's face, arms and legs before they arrive at school.







Behaviour Update

We have been working hard to promote positive behaviour across the school, recognising and celebrating examples when we see it. There has been a focus on ensuring our routines are embedded across the school and our expectations are high. We are pleased to share that there has been a huge improvement in the way that pupils are leading in from the playground and walking around the school. Pupils are also sharing the school charter at the start of each day to remind themselves of the expectations that they decided on together with school council at the start of the year.

Recognition Board

Our Recognition Board has now been in place for a full term. In KS1, this is linked to the characteristics of effective learning and in KS2, it is linked to our school motto of 'Believe, Enjoy, Strive and Succeed' and our Christian Values of 'Friendship, Service, Compassion, Forgiveness and Thankfulness'. Pupils are recognised for showing these characteristics, both in the classroom and around the school and are moved to this characteristic/value as a model to others. The pupils enjoy moving their names on the Recognition Board and the pupils are really proud of each other, which is lovely to see. They also earn a house point when they move their name and we are looking forward to seeing the winning house at the end of the year. STRIVE won the total last year, so let's see if one of the other houses can knock them off the top spot this year!

Lunch Hall and Family Dining Experience

Our lunch hall continues to be a success following the change in ethos to a more family orientated dining experience and having listened to pupil voice last term, we have increased the time, both in the hall for eating and also on the playground so that the pupils have enough time to eat and are also ready for learning after lunch. New equipment is also on order this term for the playground and we have our play leaders in place to help run games on the playground and zone managers helping with the equipment. It is great to see the pupils taking responsibility for their playground and helping their peers to have a happy, successful lunch time. The peer mentors are still working hard and are looking forward to the arrival of the buddy bench. They will also be meeting with one of our colleagues from Head Start, who initially trained them to see how we can improve their role on the playground ready for September.
