Namaste!

We are officially an international school with friends across the globe. Our recent trip to India has been fruitful and has brought us an opportunity to focus on environmental issues on a global scale. Our children here at St. Mary's will soon be tackling the issue of waste and recycling collaboratively with our colleagues in India. The visit also enabled us to secure some wonderful resources and curriculum ideas to raise our standards even further in Religious Education, Maths, Arts and Sciences.

It was truly amazing to see the depth of knowledge the children had and the impact that a high focus on learning tables has had. I was amazed that by the end of Year 3 the very large majority of pupils could recite their times tables to 12 x 12. This has inspired me to review our pedagogy here and raise the bar even further as to what we can all achieve with our pupils and children if we perhaps focussed a little harder on making the most of small opportunities to recite tables. One child I met had read 300 books in one year and could recite his 72 times tables with ease! Perhaps we could all take more time to be thankful for the wealth of resources and educational facilities that we have around us.

May I thank Mrs. Cotton and the Governing Body for having the vision to secure this for our children.
