Collection

Forest School

Following an exciting and rewarding year last year in Forest School, we are looking forward to a year full of fun, challenge and even more exciting activities. Our aim is that all children will take part in Forest School activities throughout the year. This term it is the turn of Years 5 and 6. Year 6 will have their sessions on a Tuesday morning and Year 5 will have their session on a Wednesday morning. During these sessions, we will carry out a range of different activities to develop team work and collaboration skills, resilience and perseverance, environmental awareness and fine motor control through the use of the different woodland tools. All these skills will help them in their classroom learning. In addition, we will be running extra sessions for some children who may benefit from more work on a specific learning skill. If your child has been chosen to take part in one of these sessions, you will already have received a letter. To help your child make the most of their time in Forest School, we ask that you send them in with the correct clothing as described on the letter. We do have a small stock of outdoor clothing we can let the children borrow but we do not have enough for all children. Thank you in anticipation of your support.

<u>Attendance</u>

Last year was our best attendance for several years. We achieved 96%. This is above the national average and shows what team work and a little grit and determination can do. Please do continue to support the school in this as it makes a huge difference. We have improved hugely and I know we can push it a little more. Let's try for 97%+ this year and have the best attendance in Folkestone! Your children deserve it.

<u>Uniform</u>

All staff will be making sure that all pupils are wearing the correct uniform over the next few weeks.

BOYS: Navy v-neck jumper, grey trousers/shorts, white shirt, Academy tie, navy/grey/black socks, black shoes (no trainers). **GIRLS:** navy cardigan/v-neck jumper, grey pinafore/skirt/trousers, white blouse, Academy tie, navy tights/white socks, black shoes (no high heels or trainers), blue check (no stripes) dress.

Reception children wear white polo shirt and no tie during their first year.

School ties may be purchased from the school, payment to be made via parent pay.

Water bottles may be purchased from the school, payment to be made via parent pay.

Children should be in possession of t-shirt, shorts and a pair of plimsolls for the PE lessons and it would be appreciated if the parents of young children could provide the type of plimsoll which has an elastic tongue, or alternatively substitute elastic for laces in the traditional plimsoll. A simple bag (with name on the outside) should be provided so that the plimsolls may be left on your child's cloakroom peg. Drawstring bags are available from the school, payment to be made via parent pay. Navy jogging/ tracksuit trousers, trainers can be used for the school field.

All clothing should be clearly marked with the owner's name and it is worthwhile checking from time to time to see that the marking is still discernible.

Please ensure your child is wearing the right uniform as is displayed in the school office and on our website.

If there are extenuating circumstances regarding the correct uniform, please contact Mrs. Milton or Mrs. Harrison in our FLO office for guidance. They are based in the blue mobile on the infant playground.

School Council

At the end of last term, each class voted for their new school councillors. This was done in a democratic way with a secret ballot in each class. The new school councilors have a big responsibility in being the voice of their class mates within the school. They are expected to be role models of excellent behaviour and conduct around the school, wearing the correct uniform at all times, including the prized gold tie.

In the last year, the school councillors were consulted on the new playground and playground charter in KS2 and they ran a road safety competition. They devised a pupil survey which was fed back to the senior leadership team and gave the leadership team an idea of what the children felt about their school. They tasted sausages to choose which they wanted for school dinners. They were also given the opportunity to visit the Mayor's office to see how a democratic body works in practice. Who knows what ideas this school council will come up with or be consulted on. It is a new experience for them and one which I am sure they will take on with a sense of responsibility and pride.

This year, we are making some changes to the timings of school council. As it is important for the children to miss as little of their learning time as possible, we will be having breakfast meetings instead. The children will be asked to arrive at 8.00 am, along with the normal breakfast club and we will have breakfast together, whilst having our meetings.

We look forward to working with a new set of school councillors and seeing them grow in confidence as the year goes on.
