Principal Comments

Our new members of the school in Reception have all been in and are settling really well with only a few tears (from the parents). I'd like to thank all of the parents, nursery and reception teams for making these huge milestones in our young children's lives so easy. I can't wait to see the children all in full time soon! I must thank you all too. The children look so smart and have all been very punctual in coming to school.

School has started with our ever rich curriculum experiences. We have had Victorian day, a troll party, cultural cuisine, Indian dancing and other wonderful experiences for the children. The Forest School has also been super busy with our children busy maintaining the woods! Mrs. Judd is now nearly fully qualified too, so we will soon have even more opportunity to cook on open fires and use real wood cutting tools. Both Mr. Warner and Mrs. Judd have set up a new outdoor classroom, which will give the children a chance to explore the wildlife and habitats even in the pouring rain!

Through our rich and broad curriculum, we have also achieved the International Schools Award. Our international work doesn't stop in the classroom either. Over the summer, I was supporting head teachers in India by training them in school leadership so that they are equipped to run their schools. This is hugely important charity work which reaches the poorest and most remote villages in India where education has only been a right since 2011.
