With Ofsted identifying that we all need to work together to raise attendance, it is clear we have risen to the challenge. We are now at 95.4%, which puts us on track to meet our end of year target. May I thank you all so much for your efforts. Please do aim to send your child in every day. We have recently revived our rewards too! From this week onwards:

Any class with 98% or higher each week will earn a non-uniform day.

Any child with 100% each week will earn a raffle ticket. This will be drawn termly with small prizes for the child drawn from each class. These will be pocket toys, stationery, stickers and other fun things.
